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PAC: B Community Event Draws Attention to Bullying

The Lowellville Parent Advisory Committee for Bullying (PAC-B) held a community information night for all parents and students in grades 7-12. The PAC-B committee consisted of students, parents, teachers and administration. The team worked vigorously to put together a community night, which allowed both students and parents to be educated on certain topics that pertained to bullying both inside and outside of the school. The committee reached out to the Mahoning County Juvenile Court to sense their interest in helping the committee present to the community. In short, Jim Delucia, director of clinical services, Judge Theresa Dellick, Magistrate Carla Baldwin, and Sharon Fisher, probation supervisor joined forces with the committee in order to present to the community. Mr. Delucia explained, "So many schools have

thought about this concept of including parents and their child but nobody has actually followed through with it, Lowellville is the first!" The team of court officials presented to the audience on several different topics which included: healthy relationships, cyber bullying, social media and much more. Overall, roughly 40 students and parents attended the presentation.

The PAC-B committee received exceptional feedback from the parents and students within the audience. Individuals were divulged in superb conversation and exceptional questions were posed, which allowed for several thoughts on the committee's next plan of action. The committee plans to meet again as early as September of next school year in order to keep the community abreast of

Lowellville's policies and procedures when certain aspects of bullying occur. During the 2017-2018 school year, the committee plans on delivering a fall presentation in October, which is National Bullying Awareness Month and also an additional spring event. The presentations will be geared towards both elementary and high school students.

The trip continued to the Marine Corps

Memorial, Lincoln Memorial Reflecting Pool, Korean Memorial, Lincoln Memorial and then to the World War II Memorial. Overall, it was quite a walk! The day continued with excitement as the students boarded the bus to visit the Jefferson Memorial which is located along the Tidal Basin. This presented a dramatic view of Washington D. C. for the students. A short walk from there to the amazing Franklin Delano Roosevelt Memorial finished the tour with the powerful Martin Luther King Jr. Memorial. The day ended with some savory treats at the hotel and private pizza party. The second day included a delicious breakfast and trip to the White House. After that, students visited the grounds

ROCKETS AWAY!




We are the Lowellville Rockets, and as a culminating activity in our 8th grade science classes, we take time out to do an entire unit on rocketry! Learning STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering & Mathematics) principles through rocketry keeps our students interested as the school year winds down and helps them to explore career options in the STEM fields. In our modern world, students

rarely get to build something with their hands like a model rocket, so they feel a sense of accomplishment when their rocket is constructed and then launched successfully. The construction process teaches students how to measure variables such as altitude, trajectories, and other engineering variables. They learn concepts such as gravity, thrust, trajectory, aerodynamics, Newton's Laws of Motion, and problem-solving skills. The students can also experiment with variations among different rockets, such as number of fins, and analyze how these variables may affect a launch. Through this experimentation, cause and effect is not

just a theory, but something they can watch play out in front of them. We also learn about NASA's accomplishments, and the students gain a better appreciation for and understanding of what they do.
